Sports

As well as undertaking the physical education statutory curriculum, the children of the Federation will compete in a comprehensive programme of athletics and sports against children from schools in the catchment area and beyond.

The school focuses on aspects of health and well-being within the thematic work of the class and incorporates outdoor areas into daily learning experiences.

Curricular Arrangements

During the year, both schools continued with their implementation of the Curriculum for Wales for pupils aged 3-11. In line with the expectations for all schools in Wales, further steps were taken to develop the Curriculum for Wales as it has been statutory since September 2022. Pupils were given more opportunities to make decisions about their own learning.





Learning and Teaching

The working relationship is commendable here within the Federation. We are working on a new curriculum for Wales set by the Welsh Government. As staff, a range of strategies are used to track and monitor pupils' progress. In addition, all staff attended several various courses on curriculum developments during the year. All information about the new Curriculum is available on Hwb. Through our recognition of each child's needs, our aim here within the Federation is to respond proactively to ensure that each individual pupil reaches their full potential, whatever their ability, and grow into independent learners who are valued members of our community.

School Development Plan 2022-2023

The Federation's Development Plan is a live document that provides a strategic direction for the year to come. Last year there were 4 main priorities.

PRIORITY 1 - Ensure learning experiences that provide opportunities for pupils to expand and deepen cross-curricular and holistic skills within valid contexts.

PRIORITY 2 - Adapt pupil progress monitoring procedures and continue to further refine formative assessment strategies and empower pupils to be confident learners, who know how to learn.

PRIORITY 3 Develop the Federation pupils' oral skills (The Welsh Language).

PRIORITY 4 Plan and measure the impact of interventions and ensure progress of borderline pupils.

Language

Ensure, through purposeful and sensitive nursery provision and organisation, that all children are given a firm grounding in Welsh to enable them to reach the goal of full bilingualism in due course.

3-8 years Class

Build on the foundations laid for the Welsh language through nursery education. Strengthen and develop the mother tongue of Welsh learners and, in the case of children from Welsh-speaking homes, extend their grasp of English.

8-11yrs Class

Strengthen and develop each child's Welsh and English in all their passive and active aspects, to ensure that they can speak, read, and write fluently and confidently in both languages when they transfer to secondary school. Special provision is made for latecomers.

The Gwynedd Primary Schools Welsh Language Charter

The Federation is fully committed to the Gwynedd Primary Schools Welsh Language Charter. The Gwynedd Primary Schools Welsh Language Charter derives from the detailed work of the Working Group for Influencing Social Use of the Welsh Language amongst Children. Its primary function is to ensure that the Welsh language, and its social use by our children and young people, flourishes. The seven aims of the Charter are used as instruments to measure progress in the use of the language together with the success of our schools' plans.



Additional Learning Needs:

Mrs Kayla Lockett is the ALN Co-ordinator at Ysgol Pennal, and Mrs Eirlys Wyn Jones is the ALN Co-ordinator at Ysgol Dyffryn Dulas.

Mrs A O Roberts is the ALN designated Governor.

Many children have additional needs within an area of the curriculum or medical needs at some point in their time at school. Sometimes we are aware of this early on during a pupil's time with us or even before they join, and at other times we raise concern during their education. Within the Federation, the additional needs of pupils are usually identified by the classroom teachers or colleagues through observing, testing, assessment and consultation with parents, previous school records and health agencies. Our Additional Learning Needs Policy was written considering the new ALN Code of Practice. Parents are consulted and invited to attend meetings with the ALN Coordinator and support services, including a statutory annual review. ALN provision is carefully designed to ensure that it meets pupils' needs effectively and that details are recorded and monitored in Individual Learning Plans. An ALN Provision Map sets out the provision the school offers to pupils of the Federation.

Well-being

Well-being has been a priority for the school in recent years. We continue to work closely with the authority's Welfare Officer to support pupils and families. The school has a policy of fruit only as playtime snacks. We grow fruits and vegetables. Kitchen contractors have designed a specific menu to meet with requirements of the Welsh Government's Appetite for Life. A healthy menu is promoted at lunchtime. For drinking, only water is allowed.
